AUSTAMP 90

A perfins meeting was held on the Saturday afternoon. There was no formal agenda, no formal minutes but a record of the meeting follows

The need for a constitution The meeting discussed the need for a constitution and agreed on the desirability of having one; partly to assist decision making processes and partly to enable the Society to seek funding (e.g. from APF) for any projects it may undertake.

Purchase of a Society perforator All in attendance at the meeting agreed that it would be desirable to purchase a Society perforator. The suggestion was made, and endorsed, that we might be able to purchase this out of the perfins circuit commission. Members suggested that Badderly & Co. of London or Slopers, would be possible sources of supply.

probability, the standards would develop naturally and would be shaped by the exhibitors themselves in the light of their results at exhibitions and feedback from judges and other collectors.

It was agreed that to promote interest in perfins and to assist in demonstrating their importance to the philatelic world, members of the Society should all be encouraged to enter a perfins exhibit at Newcastle 91(in June 1991). This will be a State level exhibition, although the Traditional Philately Section will have National Class Status. It was suggested that the Newcastle Philatelic Society might be encouraged to have a special perfins class. It was also suggested that the Society might wish to donate a special prize for the best perfins exhibit (this would need to be canvassed among members).

Australian Perfins Circuit Jill & John Grant apologised for the delays in the circuit caused by work pressures and their involvement with Austamp 90. Jill advised that there were 6 books currently in circulation and a further 2 waiting to be sent out.

<u>Australian Commercial Perfins</u> book John Grant advised that the book was nearing completion and showed a draft copy to the meeting.

EXHIBITS AT AUSTAMP 90

Barry Jarrett displayed 4 frames of "NSW Official Mail, Stamps & Postal Stationery" and received a Large Silver medal, together with a Special Award by the Jury. Some highlights and rarities from this wonderful exhibit were:

- . Government Railways cover with 1d Shield pair with GR perfins, one upright the other inverted
- . 1901 Newspaper wrapper punctured GR
- . "OS/NSW" Type A(10 pin S) on cover
- . "GSB/NSW" on NSW 2d & GSB on cover
- . First Watermark Roos to B2 mint punctured OS/NSW
- . Pair of 1d red KGV die 3 punctured OS/NSW Type C
- . KGV 5d on 4 1/2d, block of 12 punctured OS/NSW, the top row double!
- . 3d 3rdwmk Roo with OS/NSW punctured on top of the Commonwealth OS
- . 6d 1stwmk Roo, OS/NSW inverted
- . 1/- Lyrebird with the 1933 NSW OS (previously existence unconfirmed)

Jill & John Grant displayed 5 frames of Australian Commercial perfins categorised (as before) by the occupation of the user companies. About 120 proving covers are included. This exhibit was awarded a Vermeil. They have increased the size of their exhibit one frame at each exhibition it has been entered into. Again a wonderful exhibit.

Congratulations also to the other Club members who exhibited in other areas also with considerable success.

NESCA (in purple ink) used by Shortland County Council Nesca House King St , Newcastle 13/2/67


AMP Society used by Australian Mutual Provident Society

The normal reason for perforating stamps with initials was to prevent office staff from stealing a firm's stamps and selling them back to the Post Office. But this was not the only application of Sloper's invention. Sloper had originally marketed his punch for cancelling cheques with the words "PAID" or "CANCELLED" and, at first glance, I




was of the opinion that the perforated initials may have been applied to the 6d fiscal stamp as some form of cancellation. It was reasonable to theorise that two firms of solicitors, as parties to a deed or agreement, had cancelled the stamp in such a way that the perforated initials tied the stamp to the document. But this theory foundered when I realised that the initials were reversed (when viewed from the front of the stamp) and that it would have been necessary to apply the perforation from the back of the document for this effect to have been achieved. While this could have happened it seems more logical to conclude that the stamp was perforated, face down, before being attached to the document.

It is not unreasonable to surmise that two solicitors emigrated to New Zealand about 1868 or 1869, bringing with them the very latest in office equipement — a punch or punches for the perforation of stamps with initials. The solicitors may well have set up practice in the same town, even in adjoining rooms in the same office block. Unfortunately, I have been unable to find any record of any Dunedin legal firms or even individual solicitors which would account for the abbreviations N,E or F & Company. But of course documents from anywhere in Otago would have been stamped at Dunedin and it could well be that my mysterious solicitors were located at some other centre in this gold-rich province.


In the meantime the mystery remains. The users of the two different but similar, perfins remain unknown, the reason for the perforation of the stamp (was it a cancellation or was it a security measure?) is still but a matter of conjecture, and why should there be two different sets of initials on the one stamp? Was either perfin applied to postage stamps? Who knows, we may yet discover a Full-face Queen perfin.
